

Head Start is a national, child development program, created in 1965, for economically disadvantaged children three to five years old and their families. Head Start promotes school readiness and focuses on helping preschoolers develop the early reading and math skills they need to be successful in school. Head Start enhances the social and cognitive development of children through the provision of educational, health, nutritional, social and other services to eligible children and families. Head Start engages parents in their children's learning and helps them in making progress toward their educational, literacy and employment goals. Significant emphasis is placed on the involvement of parents in the administration of the program.

## **Disability Services**

The Head Start Program promotes recruitment and enrollment of children with disabilities. Children are given the needed services directly in the classroom in collaboration with The Early Education Center and/or direct services provided by special education Head Start staff. Early Head Start children with disability services receive collaborative home visits with The Early Education Center therapist and their assigned home visitor. This model provides reduced visits for parents and a cohesive team for families and children. Children with disabilities are included in all aspects of the Head Start Program. In addition, transportation is provided to children on active services within the boundaries of Unified School District #308. These services are at no cost to Head Start families.

## **Mental Health Services**

Head Start provides mental health services to families in a variety of ways. Each child's social and emotional development is screened approximately every six months. Mental health support services are offered based on the screening results or as a result of parental request. Prenatal women served by Early Head Start are offered the opportunity for post-partum depression screenings and support. Families are connected to services that meet their individual needs and preferences. One time consultations are free of charge to Head Start families. Assistance is provided to connect with ongoing counseling services within the community. All services and referrals are confidential.

The Early Head Start Program is sponsored by Unified School District #308, in conjunction with the Head Start Program, and provides services to 60 families including pregnant women, and families with children ages birth to three years old. The program partners with existing early childhood programs including the Reno County Health Department, The Early Education Center, The Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services (SRS), and St. Francis Academy to provide services.

Early Head Start is a unique opportunity to provide comprehensive services to expectant parents and families with infants and toddlers. Because of their vulnerabilities, very young children and their families require services of the highest quality. Early Head Start must meet the federal income guidelines just as Head Start; thus serving low-income families. The major difference in service provision of Early Head Start and Head Start is that Early Head Start focuses on the relationship between parent and child; whereas Head Start works with children to provide a consistent environment where children can continue to meet developmental milestones, develop literacy skills, and excel in school readiness activities.



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
## **Store to Door**





Interfaith Housing Services Rental Program develops affordable rental housing for many households unable to lease on the open market. IHS currently has 140 rental units in Reno, Harper and Ford Counties. IHS rental units are available for those needing special housing assistance with priority given to the elderly, household members with disabilities, and low-income families.



In the beginning, one of the greatest needs realized with the rental program was the creation of affordable, fully accessible homes for household members with disabilities. Nearly 60% of all program participants have a disability; having access to this program is vital for their integration in our community as most often their only recourse would be an institution.

Each of our units exceed the Section 8 and Housing Quality Standards established by HUD and the State of Kansas, many of our clients find Interfaith Housing through other agencies such as the Cowley County Housing Authority. While providing a safe and affordable dwelling is important, most of our units offer amenities not available in comparable-priced units on the open market. IHS is dedicated to providing units that our residents will appreciate for years to come.
