PEACE TERMS ARE GOING TO GERMANY

TELTON CARRIER STARTED FROM VERSAILLES AT NINE O'CLOCK LAST NIGHT

HUN DELEGATES TO GO HOME FOR CONFERENCE

All Communications Between the Entente Peace Delegates and German Delegates at Versailles Are Kept Secret

Terms of Treaty With Austria Are Now Being Worked Into Conference—To Call for Sharing of Information With Germany

Paris, May 8.—A copy of the treaty is well on its way to Berlin. A German courier left at 9 o'clock last night bearing it with Count Brockdorff-Rantzau's first report on the negotiations.

Intimations reaching the peace conference from Versailles lead to the belief that two or three members of the German peace delegation probably will return to Germany to consult their government, the others remaining at Versailles.

Germany has not yet submitted any communication with regard to the peace treaty.

All the exchanges between the delegations at Versailles and the home governments are being kept secret.

Prepare Austrian Treaty

The council of four with Premier Orlando of Italy present, began to work on the Austrian treaty. The presentation of peace terms to the Austrians, Hungarian and Bulgarian delegations.

The Austrian treaty has begun to take form. Portions of it already have been drafted so that it is expected that instead of Germany being required to pay the entire indemnity demanded by the victors, a considerable sum will be demanded from Austria. The estimate of this sum at present being five billion crowns.

This indemnity provision, and the delimitation of the frontiers of the new states will be the main features of the treaty now in making. Provision is to be made for dividing Austria-Hungary's previous domain among the new states formed from territory formerly belonging to that empire. The frontiers between Germany, Austria and Italy and probably the Adriatic settlement also will be included in the treaty.

It is expected that the United States will insist on the inclusion of a clause in the treaty mandating that President Wilson will arbitrate the matter to come to a settlement.

Austria On the Way

Paris, May 8.—The French government office received information late today that the Austrian peace delegation had left Vienna last night and would reach St. Germain probably tomorrow.

VERSAILLES SCENE WAS TENSE FOR ALL

TOOK HALF HOUR FOR GERMAN TO MAKE THEIR REPLY TO PREMIER CLEMENCEAU

Speech Was Translated

Was no Puff and Gilt of the Terms as in Other Peace Treaties

Theatrical Ceremony

Premier Clemenceau Made Abrupt Ending of the Session With a Few Simple and Short Words

Verailles, May 8.—The scene at yesterday's session of the peace conference when the terms of the treaty were presented to the German delegation, was an imposing one, and the French was not without its tense moments. Indeed, the entire half hour which it took Count Von Brockdorff-Rantzau to deliver his reply to Premier Clemenceau, and Premier Lloyd George, and the Premier, was translated sentence by sentence by the German interpreters who did not fail to bring out with full emphasis every sharp point in it and the three allied statements put their heads together in silent anger at more than one of the German spokesman's statements, as if they were deliberating upon advisability of an immediate answer.

End Was Short

The program was unaltered, however, even when the German representative had finished Premier Clemenceau's cross and put the customary phrase: "Has anyone further proposals to make?" And when there was no response, continued: "The allied triumvirate remained silent for a full hour of discussion of the terms of the peace treaty."

The scene within the hall during the ceremony had much of the pomp and solemnity of a display of court and military uniform, and the congress of Berlin and Vienna.

GETTING EVEN BETTER

Wheat Exports Tense During April by 63,000,000 Bushels

Washington, May 8.—An increase of 63,000,000 bushels in the winter wheat prospective production was shown today when the department of agriculture announced its forecast for a crop of 390,000,000 bushels based on conditions existing May 1.

Prospective rice production was forecast at 122,016,000, an increase of about 22,000,000 over the April forecast.

The May 1 condition and production of forecast winter wheat by production districts are: Missouri, condition 101 per cent; production 17,425,000.

Nebraska, condition 101 per cent; production 17,700,000.

Kansas, condition 103 per cent; production 15,125,000.

Oklahoma, condition 102 per cent; production 14,125,000.
