

THEY DIED IN THE ARGONNE BATTLE

Reno county men who gave their lives in the Argonne battle:

DWIN ANDERSON, orderly, Co. E, 137th Inf., 35th div., gassed Sept. 23 at Baulny hill. Died two weeks later. Home, Nickerson.

EARL F. BLAVINS, stable sergeant Headquarters Co., 110th Engineers, 35th Div. disabled by gassing during battle. Died few weeks later at Commerce. Home, Hutchinson.

OSCAR E. CRAIG, Co. I, 353rd Inf., 82d div. disabled by gassing. Died few weeks later. Home Hutchinson.

WARREN F. DAVIS, Co. G, 137th Inf., 35th div., wounded near Baulny hill, Sept. 28; died next day. Home Nickerson.

HOBART D. EDWARDS, corporal Co. E, 137th Inf., 35th div. mortally wounded at Montrebeau wood, Sept. 28; died two days later. Home, Nevada.

NEIL D. FENTON, corporal 26th Inf., 1st div., killed near Exermont, Oct. 9, while trying to rescue wounded comrade. Awarded Distinguished Service Cross posthumously. Home, Hutchinson.

JOHN H. FERGUSON, Machine Gun Co., 137th Inf., 35th div., killed in action near Cheppy Sept. 27. Home, Hutchinson.

SERAPHIN FIORI, corporal machine gun co., 137th Inf., 35th div., mortally wounded at Baulny hill, Sept. 28, dying seven days later. Home, Nickerson.

LESTER G. FOSTER, corporal Co. E, 137th Inf., 35th div., wounded at Charpentry, Sept. 28, dying two days later. Home, Hutchinson.

SAMUEL C. HASTON, Co. H, 140th Inf., 35th div., killed in action at Vagnon's hill, Sept. 26. Home, Hutchinson.

CARROLL D. HOHRISON, Headquarters Co., 137th Inf., 35th div., killed near Montrebeau wood, Sept. 28. Home, South Reno township.

WM. G. HOLMES, 9th Field Signal Bn., 5th div., disabled by gassing in Argonne October, and died few weeks later at base hospital. Home, Langdon.

LARUE S. KINGSBURY, Co. C, 353rd Inf., 89th div., killed in action at Bantheville wood, Oct. 24. Home, Hutchinson.

LESLIE L. MCGAHEN, Co. F, 166th Inf., 42nd Div., killed in action in Argonne, Oct. 8. Home Hutchinson.

ARDEN H. MCKEE, corporal Co. E, 137th Inf., 35th Div., killed in action near Baulny hill, Sept. 29. Home, Medford township.

JAMES E. MAYNARD, medical corps, killed in action in the Argonne. Home, Lincoln township.

ROY H. NEWTON, 110th ammunition train, 35th Div., disabled in Argonne and died few weeks later, Dec. 9, at Commerce. Home, Hutchinson.

FRED NORRIS, Co. A, 110th Engineers, 35th Div., killed in action near Charpentry, Sept. 29. Home, Hutchinson.

AARON A. PLATNER, captain 9th Inf., Second division, killed in action near Sedan, early in November, Distinguished Service Cross posthumously awarded. Home formerly in Hutchinson.

OTIS W. RICE, Co. K, 353rd Inf., 88th Div., killed in action in assault on Barrefont heights, Nov. 2. Home, Hutchinson.

CHARLES SMILEY, Co. L, 28th Inf., First division, wounded near Exermont, Oct. 4, died following day. Home, Haven.

HOWARD E. TAYLOR, Headquarters Co., 137th Inf., 35th Div., killed in action near Charpentry, Sept. 28. Home, Hutchinson.

ED VERMILLION, Machine gun Co., 137th Div., killed in action near Montrebeau wood, Sept. 28. Home, Hutchinson.

HENRY JOHN WEAVER, machine gun Co., 137th Inf., 35th Div., killed in action near Exermont, Sept. 29. Home, Hutchinson.
